This is a collision involving a vehicle on road or in a public place [area] that has caused damage, death or injury to a person, animal another vehicle or property.

Statistics cont.....

- Annually 1.35M pple are killed on roads globally and daily 3,700 pple are killed in crashes involving cars, buses, trucks, Motorcycles..
- And on average 1 person is lost every 25 seconds in a crash
- Low income Countries have 1% of registered motor vehicles but contribute 13% of all traffic deaths globally





statistics cont.....

- Road crashes are the leading cause of death in children btn 5-14 years
- More than ½ of these crash victims are vulnerable road users (pedestrians, cyclists...)





Major Causes of Accidents

>Speeding -Speeding causes drivers to lose control or their vehicles, increases stopping time (incase of emergency situation) and decreases the effectiveness of mechanisms. The higher the speed of the car, the severe the injuries incase of an accident and the lower the chances of survival. 1/20/2023





Causes of accidents cont...

➤ Mechanical condition of a vehicle; mechanical problems due lack of maintenance or defects in auto parts can cause or contribute to a tragic wreck

Leading Mechanical problems include

➤**Tyres**; One of the top mechanical faults that can cause an accident is faulty tyres. If the tyres are worn out and the tread is diminished the tyres are more likely to slip and it could take a driver longer to stop due to the tyre weakened grip on the road





Leading Mechanical problems cont...

➤ **Brakes**; Faulty brakes can prevent the driver from being able to slow down or stop suddenly if a traffic condition requires him to do so. The end result may be collision

Brakes system can be WARN brake lines, warn brake pads and discs or malfunctions of the antilock brake system

Leading Mechanical problems cont...

- > Steering and suspension System; if the steering and suspension fails, a driver can lose control of their vehicle and collide with another vehicle
- > Headlights and Tail lights; working lights are essential for safe driving in bad weather and at Night, Faulty lights can make it impossible for the driver to see or to be seen 13





Leading Mechanical problems cont...

➤ Windshield Wipers; while having working windshield wipers may not seem to be a big deal, they are crucial for safe driving, if they are defective or wornout, they will not clear the rain debris off the windshield and will dramatically reduce a drivers ability to see their environments clearly

Causes of accidents cont...

➤ **Bad Roads**; Poorly maintained roadways cause accidents in a variety of ways, mostly instances the driver may attempt to avoid a certain situation like potholes or pooling water which causes accidents





Causes of accidents cont...

• Reckless driving i.e overtaking in corners, failing to give signals, drifting, into another lane, using handheld phones, failure to respect traffic lights, failing to stop at pedestrian crossings, distracted driving etc. {REF:T&RS Act,1998 AMEND 2020}
